




### **VIRTUAL BACK TO SCHOOL NIGHT**

**Students in PreK 3 and PreK 4 should wear their red PE shirt and black PE shorts. Students in Kindergarten-7<sup>th</sup> grade should wear their dress school uniform. If pictures are on a scheduled PE day, students may wear their tennis shoes with their dress school uniform.**

**Students in 8<sup>th</sup> grade should follow the dress up guidelines for individual pictures. The 8<sup>th</sup> grade class picture will be postponed to a later date.**

## HELP KEEP SJCS HEALTHY



We appreciate all the support and understanding of our SJCS parents, students, faculty, staff, and community as we continue meeting the demands of maintaining a healthy campus environment for everyone. With the onset of the annual flu season, and because COVID-19 and illnesses like flu, colds, and seasonal allergies have similar symptoms, it is extremely important that parents and caregivers follow the following recommendations:

- Monitor your child(ren) for signs of infectious illness every day.
- Students who are sick should **NOT** attend school.

If your child has been seen by their doctor or a health provider and received a diagnosis, the school will accept the doctor's written directives on a return to school date. However, without a physician's diagnosis, it is essential for students to **stay home when sick until 72 hours after they no longer have a fever (temperature of 100.4 or higher) or signs of fever (chills, feeling very warm, flushed appearance, or sweating) without the use of fever-reducing medicine (e.g., Tylenol, Advil).**

This policy will help prevent the transmission of contagious illness and enable us to keep students and staff safe and healthy.
